Immigration

4. Academic Information

Courses

Students are able to take any course in or outside of their field of study while at NSU. Most upper level courses will require a pre-requisite, so these courses will be reviewed by academic advisors. Course listings can be found on the NSU website and will also be sent to students upon their acceptance. Syllabus for courses are available upon request.

English & Math Courses

We offer a number of courses in English and Math that do require pre-requisites to take the course. If a student is an English or Math major in at least their third year of the program, they will be able to take the courses without any prior placement exam. If a student is not in an English major at their home university and still would like to take ENGL 101, the student must have the minimum language requirement or pre-requisites on their transcript.

Study Load

In order to maintain a student's F1 status, students are required to take a minimum of 12 credit hours. Exchange students can take up to 18 credit hours on their exchange program. Any course that begins with a 0 (example ENGL 033 or READ 041) are considered remedial courses and are not covered as part of the exchange program. Students can take these courses, but will need to pay more for the course. Online courses are also NOT considered a part of the exchange program and students can take an online course, but will need to pay full price. Out of the 12 credit courses required, 9 of those credits MUST be in the classroom, not online.

Course Registration

Before coming to NSU, students will have a chance to register for their courses online. Students will receive an email asking them to review the courses schedule online and submit a list of courses they are interested in taking. The sooner the student does this, the better chance of options for courses they have as classes do fill and have limited seating. An academic advisor will then review the course interest form and enroll the student in the courses that work. The advisor will work closely with the student via online to finalize their schedule. Students will also have about 1 week after classes begin to make changes to their schedules.

Transcript

Official transcripts will be issued one month after the end of the program and 1 official transcript will be sent to the student's home university (students will pay \$9 on their student bill for this transcript). If students would like to have any additional official transcripts, they will need to contact the registrar's office at NSU prior to leaving to request one to be sent to their home address.

5. Campus Life

Housing

As an exchange student, you are required to live in a residence hall on campus. NSU has six different residence halls to choose from. A \$75 room deposit is required with their application. This deposit will be returned to the student when they complete the proper checkout procedure. If this procedure is not followed the student will not get the deposit back. Students can choose to have a roommate or have a single room which will cost more money. We cannot guarantee the student will live with an American student, but we will do our best to accommodate their requests. Meal Plan

All exchange students are required to purchase a meal plan. There are a variety of meal plan options. We recommend taking the lowest meal plan with more flex dollars that can be used in our bagel or convenience store on campus. Flex dollars carry over from fall to spring semester (not from spring to fall) and the meal plans do not carry over per semester. Health Insurance

All international students attending school in South Dakota are required to purchase the State of South Dakota Board plan. More information about this plan will be sent later this summer.

Students will receive more information on the enrollment process when they apply.

Work on Campus

Exchange students are allowed to work part-time on campus (up to 20 hours per week) in a student labor position. Must contact the International office for work approval. No work off campus is allowed. No internships are authorized during an exchange period.

6. Payment/Banking Information

Student Fees

Please find attached the cost of the fees for your exchange. Fees should be paid to the finance office within the first week of classes. It is best to transfer money to a bank account instead of carrying large amounts of cash with you.

Bank Account

We will help you when you arrive to open a US bank account if you would like. This account will help you to transfer money for your fees. There are a number of banks in Aberdeen and we will help you make the right choice for you.

7. Arrival To Aberdeen

Shuttle/Airport

For fall arrivals, we will have a charter shuttle arriving from the Minneapolis, Minnesota airport. This shuttle will depart on the Saturday and Sunday prior to orientation around 11:30 pm each evening. Students are encouraged to fly into Minneapolis and reserve the shuttle. Cost of the shuttle is around \$60. Due to cold weather and the risk of flight delays in the spring semester, this shuttle will not be available. Students who are not able to take the shuttle and/or are arriving in the spring semester will need to fly directly into the Aberdeen Regional Airport. Delta airlines is the only airline to fly into Aberdeen. Students will notify our office of their arrival and they will be greeted at the airport and taken to their residence hall. If students arrive earlier than the scheduled move in date, they may be required to stay in a hotel for a few nights before their rooms are prepared.

Temperature

If you arrive for the fall semester, you can expect warm temperatures ranging from 70F to over 100F during the day time and getting cooler in the events. Recommend shorts and light clothing with options for jackets and sweatshirts. The temperature will get cooler into the fall and snow will fall into late October. Spring arrivals should prepare for very cold temperatures ranging from 30F to negative 10F. The wind in South Dakota can be very cold making those temperatures feel colder. The beauty of the snow makes the cold temperatures not so bad!
